Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Coronavirus advice

There are currently no reported cases of Coronavirus in the parent or pupil population at Rokesly Juniors or Rokesly infant and Nursery School

We want to update you in light of the latest government advice on their measures for coronavirus and the implications for schools. At the current time schools remain open and we are carrying on business as usual.

The latest advice to schools is as follows:

Anyone (pupil or staff member) with a fever or persistent cough should not be in school and should self isolate for 7 days from the time of onset of symptoms or for longer if symptoms are still present after 7 days.

People are not expected to call 111 unless:

- a. they feel they cannot cope with symptoms at home
- b. the condition gets worse
- c. symptoms do not get better after 7 days

People will not routinely be tested

We have increased our school cleaning regimes to include more regularly disinfecting surfaces including door handles. We are continuing to focus on good hand hygiene as emphasised in previous briefings, and have purchased addition supplies of liquid soap and paper hand towels.

Coronavirus is thought to cause only a mild illness in children and young people, and it is important to remind ourselves of this.

Parents may have concerns where they have children with underlying health conditions. At present there is no advice that these children should be away from school. We will let you know if the advice changes. Parents with children with underlying conditions may want to get advice from their health professionals about this.
