


## Year 1 Opportunities for home learning WEEK 6

Monday	<p><b><u>Question starters and using a question mark</u></b> Remind yourself of the story 'The Princess and the Wizard' by Julia Donaldson <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=babXCIRMjQM">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=babXCIRMjQM</a> Using a range of question starters - Why, Can, How, Where, What, Do, When etc., write a set of questions to ask Wizard. Don't forget to use a question mark. Then your adult can pretend to be Wizard and answer your questions.</p>	<p><b><u>Position and Direction – full and half turns</u></b> Face one wall in your room. Make a <b>full turn</b>. This means you turn all the way around to face the same wall again. You have turned all the way around. Next, make a <b>half turn</b> on the spot. Which wall are you facing now? You should be facing the opposite wall that was behind you. Now, make a half turn again. You should now be facing the same wall you started facing. You can turn to the left or the right and either way will take you to the same wall. Practice in different rooms in your house.</p>	<p><b><u>Science</u></b> Recording physical properties of different materials. Choose an object for each of the following materials: metal, plastic, fabric, glass, paper and describe their properties. Is it smooth, bendy, transparent etc.?</p>									
Tuesday	<p><b><u>A Letter to Wizard</u></b> Wizard needs your help! He wants to change and be good and he wants to be friends with Eliza. Write a letter to Wizard telling him what he can do to be good and what he can say to Eliza and what he can do for Eliza to show that he has changed. Try to include one of your questions from yesterday. You will be writing a letter so you will need to use: Dear Wizard Love from Try to use the connectives 'and' 'so' and/or 'because'. Check to make sure you have your capital letters and full stops.</p>	<p><b><u>Position and Direction – Left and Right</u></b> Tomorrow we are going to practice quarter turns. For this we need to know our <b>left</b> and <b>right</b>. Practice with parents turning to the left and the right until you feel you know which is which.
